- **(3) MAJOR EVENTS COME TO D'IBERVILLE, CRUSIN THE COAST REDFISH CUP TOURNAMENT & SACRED HEART BAZAAR**

What a busy week. We had three major events take place in the City. Cruising the coast, where D'Iberville officers participated in the fun by issuing out Crusin' Citation to some of the classic car owners; Redfish cup tournament being filmed by ESPN, where we had 20 teams of fisherman competing for the top spot, and the Sacred Heart Bazaar. Because of all of the events the D'Iberville Police Officers have been busy not only making sure our street are safe, we also have made some arrest. On October 4, 2008, we arrested Quincy Barbour on the charge of Cultivation of a controlled substance, Barbour was arrested following a citizen's complaint. On October 6, 2008 in the early morning hours on October 6, 2008, D'Iberville Police Officer Lee

Donald observed Brady Frazier driving a small white vehicle near Lowe's, located at 3700 Sangani Blvd., without utilizing headlights. When Officer Donald attempted to make a traffic stop to investigate this suspicious behavior, Frazier fled west on I-10. Officer Donald pursued Frazier and a passenger west to Lorraine Rd. Frazier further attempted to elude the pursuing officer by turning off his headlights while driving on I-10. Frazier was unable to negotiate the turn onto Highway 605 from Lorraine Rd and struck a street sign. Officer Donald took both Frazier and Shawanda Montgomery into custody after determining that a Burglary had occurred at the Lowe's. On October 8, 2008, D'Iberville Police Officers responded to a citizen's complaint of "Burglary in Progress" at 10026 7th Ave. D'Iberville, MS. Patrol Officers immediately arrested one suspect. Officer Sammy Thompson and K-9 Zeus tracked the second suspect and located him in the wooded area not far from the scene of the burglary. Based on information gained, our Criminal Investigations Division determined both suspects were culpable to the burglary. In addition, it was determined one suspect was responsible for committing two other burglaries in the days following Hurricane Gustav. Investigators recovered property taken during those thefts.
